Bethany noted that Tom and the Lakes croo cleaned and cleared a lot of old nasty stuff, which will do much to make the huts special for future generations.

Secretary Report (Jared Liu)

Action: dispensed with reading the 2023 minutes, unanimously approved

Dues paying membership is strong. The last three years in order (2022 to 2024) have been 401, 437, and 469... an increase! Moreover, we're seeing an increase in the number of members who renew their membership annually without skipping a year. Jared also ran through a number of edits to the bylaws, including what will be 3-year term limits going forward, with a maximum of 4 terms (or 12 years).

Cabin Update (Phoebe)

Many hands contribute to keeping the cabin operational. Thanks to them all. There was an update about the road washout and ongoing repairs, replacement of the fridge, and user night trends. We saw lower cabin use this year, which might be a return to pre-pandemic levels. Otherwise, a few reminders: don’t turn off the propane any longer and do reserve on the website to get the lockbox code (the key isn’t at Pinkham)!

Featured Speaker (Phoebe)

1970s Trailblazing Women of the Huts, Shelters, and Trails (with apologies from the Secretary for brief notes from such amazing stories):

- Saundry Cohen: From Brooklyn to NH on a snowshoeing trip with husband, they came across John Nutter and a group on cross-country skis who convinced them to be the first Ed Squad in 1971. After a year, her husband was ready to go home, but she was loving it so much and applied to Ken Olson to be the Fall Caretaker in 1972. It nearly didn’t happen, because women weren’t allowed to do this without a male co-lead. Ultimately, a pointed conversation with an attorney and the Huts Committee worked it out. She knows Ken was supportive, too.
- Nancy Thomas: Got her first pair of Limmers for high school graduation, and presently asked when women would be able to apply to work in the huts. Thanks to Ken Olson and John Nutter, she was hired in 1972 to do guided hikes with Tom Johnson (TJ). Later, thanks to other trailblazers, she was hired to the huts, and Joel White was equally supportive. During her time, she packed 80-100 pounds, including empty propane bombs, and did everything equally with the men. Ultimately, was HM at Zool and Flea. Also spoke about how the AMC still struggles to be racially representative.
- Adele Dinsmore (not in attendance): Saw a posting for Volunteer Naturalist, and hired by John Nutter. Later interviewed with Trails Crew Board for Caretaker role. Thanks to Saundry’s trailblazing, she got the role for Speck Pond. And shout out to Larry Jenkins for the lobster

dinner! Finished by advocating to diversify the pool of candidates and the pay to provide greater access.

- Joan Chevalier: Majored in climbing trees rather than playing with dolls. Started on kitchen crew, spent 1 summer in the huts, but really wanted trails. Settled for Caretaker at Guyot, which was also amazing. Thanks to Bob Proudman for using this role to help build the case for women on trail crew. So much of who she is today is thanks to her work with the AMC.
- Anne Michalec: Garfield Caretaker in 1978. Didn't get the job the first year she applied in 1976, but Bob Proudfoot was so supportive that she reapplied. Has fond memories of being on the roof with the Greenleaf crew, passing messages to thru hikers, getting an internship in DC, listening to Bob White play the trumpet, the foo horn, and whirlies. Does not have fond memories of the black flies! Later went on to lead guided hikes, which was a dream. And thanks to the women who trailblazed for her.
